



BUILDING & HOME RENOVATIONS

You must obtain a building permit before you:

- Construct any new building over ten square meters in area or in place of another structure, such as a mobile home on your property
- Make renovations, repairs or add to a building
- · Change the use of a building
- Excavate or construct a foundation
- Construct a seasonal building
- Undertake work regarding the installation, alteration, extension or repair of an on-site sewage system

BY-LAW

The *Municipal Act* allows municipalities to pass By-laws for the regulation of many areas affecting health, safety and the enjoyment of property. The following By-laws make up part of the Town's established list: Urban Tree Removal; Animal Care and Control; Clean Yards; Property Standards; Private Outdoor Swimming Pools and Hot Tub Enclosures; Noise and Parking; and others as listed on the Town's website www.notl.com.

Contact the By-law Department at 905-468-3266, ext. 278 for more information regarding the enforcement of By-laws. The town encourages the use of the Town's Online Service Request and Complaint Form when reporting a concern.

DEVELOPMENT

The responsibility for planning in Ontario is shared between the province and municipalities. The province sets the ground rules and directions for land use planning through the *Planning Act* and the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS). In Niagara-on-the-Lake, the provincial plans, including the Greenbelt Plan, Niagara Escarpment Plan and Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, work together with the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS) to manage growth and to protect agricultural land and the natural environment. The Town is responsible for implementing the province's land use planning policy framework through the Official Plan and Zoning Bylaw and to make land use planning decisions to achieve the community's economic, social and environmental objectives. Municipal decisions must be "consistent with" the PPS, which means that municipalities are given some flexibility in deciding how best to achieve provincial policy direction.

Citizen input on development applications is an important part of the planning process. As such, public comment is actively solicited on planning matters. Public notices and information on current application and appeals can be found on the Town's website www.notl.com or by calling 905-468-3266 ext. 315.

FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

NOTL FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services Department is a volunteer organization made up of 107 firefighters who all work together to create an efficient and high-quality emergency service. With a dedication to prevention, education, and emergency response, Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services' goal is to be high-performing, progressive, and visionary in the provision of emergency services within the community.



GREEN LIGHTAWARENESS

Life and death situations are often decided on how fast help arrives. Flashing green lights are used by volunteer firefighters who are responding to an emergency. We ask you to be courteous and yield the right of way when you see an approaching vehicle displaying a flashing green light.



With barbeque season nearly underway, Fire & Emergency Services wants to remind the residents of Niagara-on-the-Lake about the importance of barbeque safety. As a reminder, barbeques are only intended for outdoor use. Carbon monoxide can reach dangerous levels and cause serious health risks if used in an enclosed space such as a garage.. It is important to keep your barbeque away from combustible items such as fences, decks, and railings and always keep them away from the side of your home and out from under eaves and overhangs.



Before using your barbeque, please follow these simple steps to prepare for the season:

- Clean the inside of your barbecue with a wire brush, ensuring all grills and burners are free of dirt, dust, grease build-up, or other debris.
- Check all hoses and connections leading from the fuel supply (natural gas or propane). Replace any hoses or connections that are cracked or damaged.
- Test for leaks by applying a 50/50 solution of water and dish soap to all connections. If bubbles appear, tighten the connections and/or replace any damaged parts.



FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS EXPIRE!

Most people are unaware that their smoke or carbon monoxide (CO) alarms may be expired. Most smoke alarms expire ten years after the date of manufacture, while most CO alarms expire 5-7 years after the date of manufacture, depending on the brand. It is extremely important that your alarms are working properly, as they are your first line of defence as an early warning during a fire or gas emergency. Most alarms will have a date that indicates when they are to be replaced by, or the date of manufacture will be on the alarm. Electronic devices don't last forever. As time passes, electronic devices may become less reliable than they once were. Smoke and CO alarms are electronic devices that operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week. They will not last forever. Check yours today! It could save your life!

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM CHECKLIST:

- Confirm your alarm is not expired and is operational
- Change your batteries at least annually
- Most hard-wired alarms still have battery backups that need to be checked so they can continue to protect you during a power outage
- Test your alarms monthly
- Ensure your smoke alarms are not dirty. Alarms can be gently vacuumed to ensure they can properly sense smoke
- Understand what the beeps or chirps mean by reading the manufacturer's instructions or the back of the device

OPEN-AIR BURNING / BACKYARD CAMPFIRES

In Niagara-on-the-Lake, open-air burns are only permitted for farmers to burn off their agricultural waste in rural areas of town. Residents with yard waste are encouraged to bundle their yard waste and place it at the road for disposal with their household waste and recycling free of charge. Open-air burning is not permitted in urban areas of town. Burning garbage or construction waste is not permitted at any time and is subject to cost recovery fees for a Fire Department's response. Niagara-on-the-Lake residents who wish to have a backyard fire are encouraged to purchase a listed, natural gas or propane fire pit or table as these devices do not give off the undesirable smoke and embers that a wood-burning fire pit produces.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

The Niagara Region is responsible for collecting waste and recycling materials in Niagara-on-the-Lake. Their website www.niagararegion.ca, contains information regarding the weekly garbage collection schedule, leaf and yard waste, branch collection, organic recycling, and household hazardous waste drop-off locations.

Broken recycling bins, organics bins and kitchen catchers can be replaced free of charge at the Town Hall Administration Building at 1593 Four Mile Creek in Virgil. New homeowners and renters are entitled to obtain one free set of bins if they don't have them when they move in. To pick up free containers, please present a copy of your transfer deed as evidence of the possession date of your home, or present a rental or lease agreement as evidence of your occupancy date.



CHOOSE A RATE PLAN THAT MEETS YOUR NEEDS

Good news—you now have a choice when it comes to your electricity pricing plan. Choose between Time-of-Use (TOU) or Tiered pricing. There is a third option coming in 2023 called Ultra-Low Overnight (ULO). Visit www.NOTLhydro.com to access the form to switch rates. Pricing below is as of February 1, 2023, and can change as directed by the Ontario Energy Board (OEB).

Time-of-Use Default Plan

The price depends on when you use electricity:

- On-Peak 15.1¢/kWh
- Mid-Peak 10.2¢/kWh
- Off-Peak 7.4¢/kWh

Peak times vary per season. Visit www.NOTLhydro.com for more details.

Tiered Rates Optional Plan

The price depends on how much electricity is used:

Tier 1 8.7¢/kWh
 Tier 2 10.3¢/kWh

Residential Tier 1 limit is first 600 kWh from May 1 - October 31. Limit is 1,000 kWh from November 1 - April 30.

Ultra-Low Overnight Optional Plan Coming Soon

The OEB will implement a new optional Ultra-Low Overnight Price Plan for Regulated Price Plan (RPP) customers, to be available before November 1, 2023. In this rate option, there will be a Low Overnight rate but the On-Peak Price will be higher. Details are not currently available.



GREEN BUTTON

Coming by Nov 2023

Green Button is a data standard that provides residential and business energy customers with more choice in how you access your electricity or natural gas usage data. Customers will also be able to authorize the secure, automatic transfer of this data to Green Button applications of their choice. Stay tuned for more information as it becomes available.

© LICENSES & PERMITS

The Town issues several licenses and permits such as:

BUILDING

Building permits are required for most construction activities, including sheds greater than 15m2 (161sf), swimming pools, and decks greater than 24" above grade. Accurate drawings and site plans are necessary for the project to be assessed for compliance with the Building Code and other applicable laws, including zoning by-laws. Please contact Building Services at 905-468-3266 ext. 287 early in the planning of a project to determine all applicable requirements.

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake has launched an online system that allows you to apply for and check the status of your application anywhere, at any time. Cloud permit allows you to start an application and finish it later, and receive email updates on the status of your permit application. You can also pay your building application fees online! Visit the Town's website to use Cloud Permit at www.notl.com/town-services/building-services

DOG

Niagara-on-the-Lake dog owners are required to register their dogs with the Town and pay an annual registration fee. All dog licenses expire on December 31 of each year and registration must be renewed annually before January 1. A renewal or a new dog license can be purchased on the Town's website with a credit card, by drop-box, or in person at the Town Administration Building at 1593 Four Mile Creek Road in Virgil, using cash, cheque or debit for payment. EVENTS

A Special Event is an event which may occupy all or part of Town owned property or may result in the disruption of the local flow of traffic. A special event may be defined as, but not limited to, a parade, festival, filming, bicycle race/tour, running event, procession, walk-a-thon, and/or any other activity that may include the following component(s):

- Street closure(s)

GAMING

The Alcohol Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) is responsible for regulating and overseeing licensed lottery events (such as bingo, raffles and the sale of break open tickets) conducted by eligible charitable and religious organizations to raise funds to support charitable purposes. As part of the AGCO's regulatory responsibilities in the charitable sector, the AGCO administers, in partnership with municipalities, the regulatory framework governing the issuance of charitable lottery licences. HERITAGE

Do I need a Heritage Permit? A Council-approved Heritage Permit is required for most alterations to properties designated under Parts IV or V of the *Ontario Heritage Act*. OPEN AIR BURN PERMIT

Permission to burn outside the urban boundary is provided on an annual basis and can be processed through a fillable form on the Town's website www.notl.com. In the event the applicant does not have access to the online form, the applicant can call the Town at 905-468-3266 prior to having a controlled open-air burn. Residential burning is not permitted.

SHORT TERM RENTAL

All Short Term Rentals (including Bed & Breakfasts, Cottages, Inns, etc.) within the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake must be licensed in order to operate. Please note that a Renewal Application must be submitted every four years to maintain an active license. Please also note: websites, such as Airbnb, VRBO etc., are only a means to advertise. PLANNING TO DIG?

Building a fence, putting in a pool, planting a tree, digging a new garden, or any other small digging project? Request a locate from Ontario One Call if you plan to dig in your yard. HONK MOBILE FAQ

HOW DOES PARKING ENFORCEMENT KNOW SOMEONE HAS PAID FOR THEIR PARKING ONLINE VIA THE HONK APP?

The online system provides Town parking enforcement officers with a real-time list of license plates belonging to people who have paid using the Honk Mobile App. Users do not require a ticket stub or receipt to place on the dashboard.

ARE USERS NOTIFIED IF THEIR SESSION IS ABOUT TO EXPIRE?

The Honk Mobile App will send users a text message 15 minutes before their parking is about to expire. Users can easily extend a session directly from their phones.

IS THE HONK MOBILE APP FREE?

A payment method is not required to download the app or to sign up for a Honk Mobile account. However, users will need a valid VISA, Mastercard, American Express, Visa Debit, Masterpass, or Paypal account to pay for parking. Please note that a convenience fee of \$0.25 is charged for each transaction.

RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS


One-hour Resident Parking Permits for Old Town are available exclusively for Niagara-on-the-Lake residents at the cost of \$21.00 (2022 rate). They can be purchased online or by visiting the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake Administration Building at 1593 Four Mile Creek Road in Virgil. These parking permits entitle the permit holder to one hour of free parking at any parking meter/pay & display machine in the Heritage District. A valid piece of identification must be shown as proof of address to obtain a permit. Permits are valid for the vehicle identified by license plate number and are non-transferable. They are valid from January 1 to December 31 and can be renewed beginning October 1 of each year.

DO I NEED TO PURCHASE A NEW PERMIT IF I CHANGE MY LICENSE PLATE?

You will need to obtain a replacement permit for a fee of \$5.50 (2022 rate).

I OWN MULTIPLE VEHICLES, MAY I MOVE THE PERMIT BETWEEN VEHICLES?

Permits are issued to a vehicle and must be attached to a license plate number.





Please keep in mind the following parking infractions while parking in Niagara-on-the-Lake:

- Directly interfering with traffic movement or snow removal.
- Parking for more than 12 hours at any one time.
- Parking in violation of No Parking zones.
- Parking within 10 metres (33 feet) of an intersection.
- Parking within 3 metres (10 feet) of a fire hydrant.
- Parking in front of or within 1.5 metres (5 feet) of a driveway.
- Blocking or partially blocking a sidewalk.

WATER & WASTEWATER SERVICES

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake owns and operates two separate drinking water distribution systems which are the Niagara-on-the-Lake drinking water system (Niagara-on-the-Lake DWS) and the Bevan Heights drinking water system (Bevan Heights DWS). The Town maintains responsibility for water distribution only; the facilities for water treatment and storage are owned and managed by the Niagara Region. The two drinking water systems distribute treated drinking water within a service area of approximately 12,600 Ha. The service area is bounded by Lake Ontario, the Niagara River, the City of Niagara Falls and the City of St. Catharines.

SAMPLE STATIONS

Curious what those green objects are that stand alone and look like green parking meters? They are water sample stations. These stations give the Town the ability to test the quality of the water we drink. As they provide a direct line to the watermain. These stations allow the Town to better enhance the Town's ability to test a wider area of the Town's water supply. With the already 11 stations within the system, the Town has a better ability to make sure the water you are drinking meets and exceeds Ministry Legislation where possible. The water system that the Town has is one of the best in the country and with the wider array of testing, we can stay on top of any issues that may arise.

WATER FACTS

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Drinking Water System includes:

- · 200 km of watermains
- 1,386 fire hydrants
- 1,358 valves
- · 2 water filling stations

The Bevan Heights Drinking Water System includes:

- 2 km of watermains
- 16 fire hydrants
- 19 valves


