Niagara-on-the-Lake was founded in 1792 as the first capital of Upper Canada and was rebuilt after the War of 1812.

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake is a popular tourist destination and is home to premier wineries, restaurants, and visitor accommodations; quaint shops and art galleries; noted historical, architectural sites; the world-renowned Shaw Festival Theatre, and much more.

BUILDING & HOME RENOVATIONS

You must obtain a building permit before you:

- Construct any new building over ten square meters in area or in place of another structure, such as a mobile home, on your property
- Make renovations, repairs or add to a building
- Change the use of a building
- Excavate or construct a foundation
- Construct a seasonal building
- Undertake work regarding the installation, alteration, extension or repair of an on-site sewage system

BY-LAW

The Municipal Act allows municipalities to pass by-laws for the regulation of many areas affecting health, safety and the enjoyment of property. The following by-laws make up part of the Town's established list: Urban Tree Removal; Animal Care and Control; Clean Yards; Property Standards; Private Outdoor Swimming Pools and Hot Tub Enclosures; Noise and Parking; and others as listed on the Town's website www.notl.com.

DEVELOPMENT

The responsibility for planning in Ontario is shared between the province and municipalities. The province sets the ground rules and directions for land use planning through the Planning Act and the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS). In Niagara-on-the-Lake, the provincial plans, including the Greenbelt Plan, Niagara Escarpment Plan and Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, work together with the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS) to manage growth and to protect agricultural land lands and the natural environment.

The Town is responsible for implementing the province's land use planning policy framework through the Official Plan and Zoning By-law and to make land use planning decisions to achieve the community's economic, social and environmental objectives. Municipal decisions must be "consistent with" the PPS, which means that municipalities are given some flexibility in deciding how best to achieve provincial policy direction.

Citizen input on development applications is an important part of the planning process. As such, public comment is actively solicited on planning matters. NOTL FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services Department is a volunteer organization comprised of 110 firefighters working together to create an efficient and high-quality emergency service. With dedication to prevention, education, and emergency response, it is Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services' goal to be high-performing, progressive, and visionary in the provisions of emergency services within the community.

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS EXPIRE!

Most people are unaware that their smoke or carbon monoxide alarms may be expired. Most smoke alarms expire ten years after the date of manufacture, while most CO alarms expire 5-7 years after the date of manufacture, depending on the brand. It is extremely important that your alarms are working properly, as they are your first line of defence as an early warning during a fire or gas emergency. Most alarms will have a date that indicates when they are to be replaced by, or the date of manufacture will be on the alarm. Most of us know that electronic devices don't last forever. As time passes, electronic devices may become less reliable than they once were. Smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are electronic devices that operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week. They will not last forever. Check yours today! It could save your life!

SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM CHECKLIST:

- Confirm your alarm is not expired and is operational
- Change your batteries at least annually
- Most hard-wired alarms still have battery backups that need to be checked so they can continue to protect you during a power outage
- Test your alarms monthly
- Ensure your smoke alarms are not dirty. Alarms can be gently vacuumed to ensure they can properly sense smoke
- Understand what the beeps or chirps mean by reading the manufacturer's instructions or the back of the device

FIRE HYDRANTS

Fire hydrants are owned and regularly maintained by the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake's Water/Wastewater Division. Hydrants are connected to watermains allowing our firefighters to access the water supply during a fire emergency. The Town's Water/Wastewater Division currently maintains 1,386 hydrants. It is vital that fire hydrants are clearly visible and accessible at all times. Property owners with fire hydrants in their yard are to ensure all long grass, shrubs, and vegetation are clear of the hydrant. During the winter, hydrants should be cleared of snow and have a 3-metre clear area on all usable sides. Every second counts in a fire emergency, and firefighters may waste valuable time trying to find and access fire hydrants that are hidden or obstructed.



GREEN LIGHT AWARENESS

Life and death situations are often decided on how fast help arrives. Flashing green lights are used by volunteer firefighters who are responding to an emergency. We ask you to be courteous and yield the right of way when you see an approaching vehicle displaying a flashing green light.

LICENSES & PERMITS

The Town issues several licenses and permits such as:

BUILDING

Building permits are required for most construction activities, including sheds greater than 108 square feet, swimming pools, decks greater than 24" above grade. Accurate drawings and a site plan are necessary in order that the project may be assessed for compliance with the Code and other applicable laws including zoning by-laws. Please contact Building Services at 905-468-3266 ext. 287 early in the planning of a project to determine all applicable requirements. See Building & Home Renovations (page 8) or visit www.notl.com/town-services/building-services for more information.

DOG

By-law 4512-11 requires that all dogs six months of age and older be licensed annually before January 1 of each year. Licenses can be purchased starting in October. Call 905-468-3266 or visit www.notl.com/town-services/animal-care-control for a list of fees and additional information.

EVENTS

A Special Event is an event which may occupy all or part of Town owned property or may result in the disruption of the local flow of traffic. A special event may be defined as, but not limited to, a parade, festival, filming, bicycle race/tour, running event, procession, walk-a-thon, and/or any other activity that may include the following component(s):

- Street Closure(s)
- Fireworks or pyrotechnics
- Live entertainment
- Temporary Structures/ Tents
- Service of food or alcohol
- Large volumes of vehicular or pedestrian traffic

Should you wish to hold a Special Event within the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake, please complete and submit a Special Event Application Form found on the Town's website www.notl.com. For more information, please email specialevents@notl.com or call 905-468-3266.

GAMING

The Alcohol Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) is responsible for regulating and overseeing licensed lottery events (such as bingo, raffles and the sale of break open tickets) conducted by eligible charitable and religious organizations to raise funds to support charitable purposes. As part of the AGCO's regulatory responsibilities in the charitable sector, the AGCO administers, in partnership with municipalities, the regulatory framework governing the issuance of charitable lottery licences. HERITAGE

Do I need a Heritage Permit? A Council approved Heritage Permit is required for most alterations to Part IV and Part V heritage designated heritage properties (designated under the Ontario Heritage Act). A list of heritage designated properties is available on the Town's Heritage web page as is the Heritage Permit Application Form for proposed alterations. OPEN AIR BURN PERMIT

Permission to burn outside the urban boundary is provided on an annual basis and can be processed through an online fillable form on the Town's website www.notl.com. In the event the applicant does not have access to the online form, the applicant can call the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake Customer Service Department or Fire & Emergency Services at 905-468-3266 prior to having a controlled open-air burn. Residential burning is not permitted.

SHORT TERM RENTAL

All Short Term Rentals (including bed & breakfasts, cottages, inns, etc.) within the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake must be licensed in order to operate. All active licenses include the license expiry date. Please note that a Renewal Application must be submitted every four years to maintain an active license. Please also note: websites, such as Airbnb, VRBO etc., are only a means to advertise. In the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake you must hold a valid Short Term Rental License to operate.

Things to Know when Parking

Do not stop, stand or park a vehicle:

- Facing the wrong way on the street or against the direction of traffic flow
- On the roadway side of any stopped, standing or parked vehicle (no double parking, stopping or standing)
- On or partly on or over a sidewalk
- Within an intersection or crosswalk
- On any outer boulevard

Do not park a vehicle:

- Within 10m (33ft) of an intersection
- Within 3m (10ft) on a fire hydrant
- On an inner boulevard
- In front of or within 1.5m (5ft) of a laneway or driveway or a curb-cut
- On either side of a roadway so as to obstruct a vehicle in the use of any laneway or driveway
- For the purpose of displaying such vehicle for sale or lease
- For a period of time exceeding 12 hours

Accessible Parking

There are several accessible parking spaces located throughout the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake; these spaces are located both on the street and in municipal parking lots. All vehicles parking in an accessible zone must display an original and current accessible permit. Any vehicle found parked in an accessible zone without the valid accessible permit will be ticketed. The fine for parking in an accessible zone is \$400.00.

Pay for Parking using Honk Mobile

Niagara-on-the-Lake visitors can dig into their pockets for their phones instead of loose change paying for parking in the Heritage District. We welcome you to use the Honk Mobile App to search, pay for and top up parking.

Honk Mobile FAQ

How does parking enforcement know that someone has paid for their parking by smartphone?

The system provides Town parking enforcement officers with a real-time list of license plates belonging to people who have paid using the Honk Mobile App. Users do not require a ticket stub or receipt to place on the dashboard.

Is the Honk Mobile App free?

A payment method is not required to download the app or to sign up for a Honk Mobile account. However, users will need a valid VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Visa Debit, Masterpass, or PayPal account to pay for parking. Please note, a convenience fee of \$0.25 is charged for each transaction.

Are users notified if their session is about to expire?

The Honk Mobile App will send users a text message 15 minutes before their parking is about to expire. Users can easily extend a session directly from their phones.

Can I still pay with coins?

Yes, the parking machines still accept all original methods of payment.

Resident Parking Permits

One hour Resident Parking Permits for Old Town are available beginning October 1 at a cost of \$21.00. They are available to purchase online or by visiting the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake Administration Building located at 1593 Four Mile Creek Road in Virgil. These Parking Permits are exclusively for residents of the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake. The permit entitles the permit holder up to one hour of free parking at any parking meter/pay & display machine in the Heritage District. A valid piece of identification must be shown as proof of address to obtain a permit. Permits are valid for the vehicle identified, by license plate number, and are non-transferable. They are valid from January 1 to December 31. Therefore, permits must be renewed each calendar year.

Q: Do I need to purchase a new permit if I change my license plate?

A: You will need to obtain a replacement permit for a fee of \$5.50.

Q: I own multiple vehicles, may I move the permit between vehicles?

A: No, the permits are issued to a vehicle and must be attached to a license plate number. If you purchase one permit and move it between vehicles you will be ticketed.

WATER & WASTEWATER SERVICES

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake owns and operates two separate drinking water distribution systems which are the Niagara-on-the-Lake drinking water system (Niagara-on-the-Lake DWS) and the Bevan Heights drinking water system (Bevan Heights DWS). The Town maintains responsibility for water distribution only; the facilities for water treatment and storage are owned and managed by the Niagara Region. The two drinking water systems distribute treated drinking water within a service area of approximately 12,600 Ha. The service area is bounded by Lake Ontario, the Niagara River, the City of Niagara Falls and the City of St. Catharines.

SAMPLE STATIONS

Curious what those green objects are that stand alone and look like green parking meters? They are water sample stations. These stations give the Town the ability to test the quality of the water we drink. They are a direct line to the watermain. These stations allow the Town to better enhance the Town's ability to test a wider area of the Town's water supply. With the already 11 stations within the system, the Town has a better ability to make sure the water you are drinking meets and exceeds Ministry Legislation where possible. The water system that the Town has is one of the best in the country and with the wider array of testing, we can stay on top of any issues that may arise.

WATER FACTS

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Drinking Water System includes:

- 200 km of watermains
- 1,386 fire hydrants
- 1,358 valves
- 2 water filling stations

The Bevan Heights Drinking Water System includes:

- 2 km of watermains
- 16 fire hydrants
- 19 valves

Did You Know?

Niagara-on-the-Lake has received regulatory relief from Lead Testing; however, bacteriological and other chemical testing is still being conducted according to provincial legislation.
