OVERVIEW OF NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE

Niagara-on-the-Lake is a beautiful historic town, home to approximately 17,500 people. Located at the tip of the Niagara Peninsula and nestled along the shores of Lake Ontario, Niagara-on-the-Lake includes Old Town, Virgil, St. Davids, Queenston and Glendale.

Niagara-on-the-Lake was founded in 1792 as the first capital of Upper Canada and was rebuilt after the War of 1812.

The Corporation of the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake employs approximately 130 people.

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake is a popular tourist destination and is home to premier wineries, restaurants, and visitor accommodations; quaint shops and art galleries; noted historical architectural sites; the world-renowned Shaw Festival Theatre, and much more.

Visitors to the Museum will see "Our Story", a permanent exhibition chronicling life in Niagara-on-the-Lake over the past 10,000 years, as well as temporary displays in Memorial Hall. Until October 31, 2019 the exhibition "From Head to Toe" explores the Museum's clothing and fashion collection. From November 11, 2019 – April 25, 2020, visitors can take in an exhibition of historic quilts.

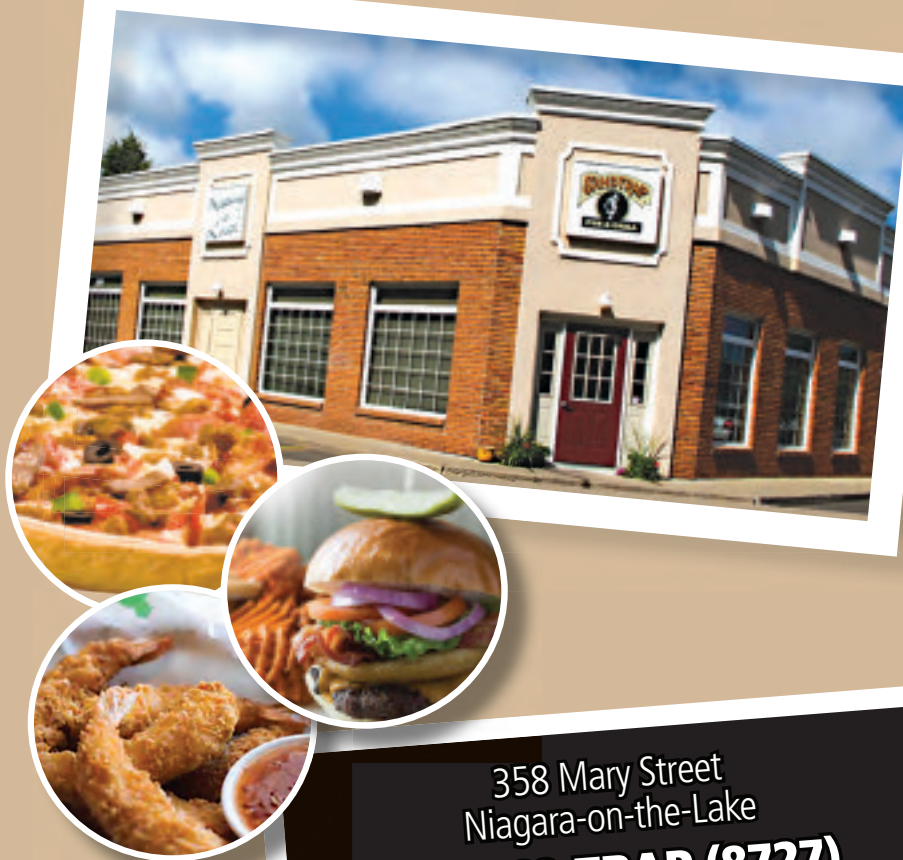

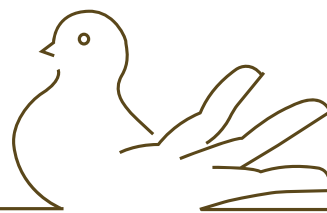
