

Landscape Plan



Hornbeam trees have a dense canopy which excels at purifying the air by capturing pollutants and releasing oxygen. Their robust root systems help stabilize soil and prevent erosion. They offer a habitat and food source for various birds and wildlife.



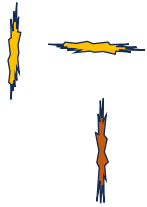
To be planted 3 to 4 metres apart at rear or proposed house along northern property line, and from edge of proposed garage toward commercial building and south-bound toward driveway.



Barberry Shrubs are hardy, colourful and grow well in full sun or partial shade. They are excellent hedge or barrier plantings, and their bright red berries further enhance their appearance in fall and winter.



To be planted as a hedge landscape feature along a 1-metre-wide landscape strip running the length of southern edge of driveway entering the property, and west to abeam the back of the commercial building.



Garden beds with layered designed using lower maintenance shrubs of varying forms and colours to achieve a mature look in a short period of time.

Ground cover plantings native to area as restorative feature per Niagara Region representative's suggestion during site visit.
