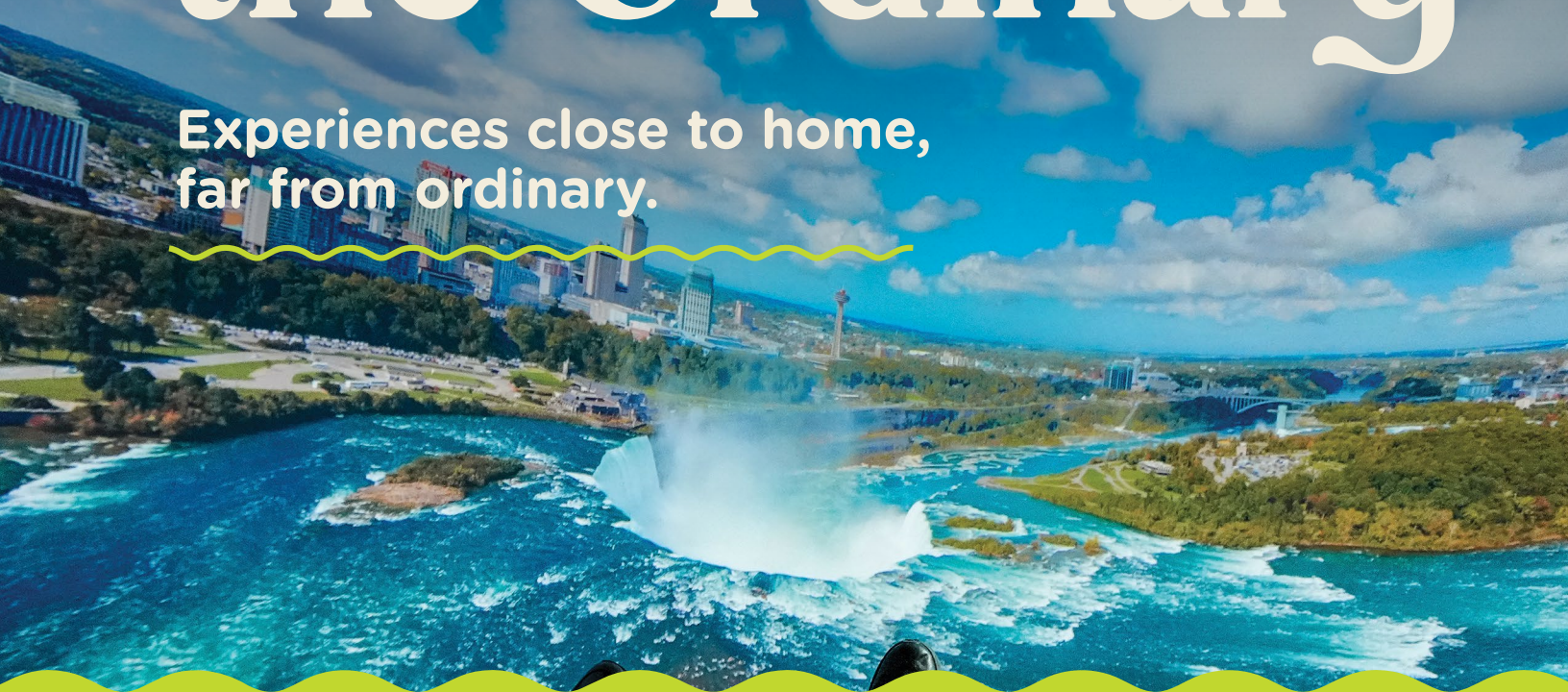

BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

All administrative functions and transactions of the cemetery are managed onsite. This includes transactions such as lot purchases, columbarium niche sales, headstones, markers, tree and bench dedications for the cemetery grounds, interments, cremation scatterings, and record and lot availability inquiries. CLIMATE CHANGE

Niagara-on-the-Lake is taking meaningful action to address climate change through a range of mitigation and adaptation initiatives. The Town is developing greenhouse gas reduction plans through a Corporate Town Operations Plan and a Community Energy and Emissions Plan, aimed at lowering emissions across both municipal operations and the broader community. Work is also underway to manage invasive species, including targeted phragmites removal at impaired sites.

To strengthen climate resilience, the Town is expanding tree planting by identifying priority locations, selecting climate-appropriate species, and growing the urban forest canopy. An ongoing natural asset inventory is helping guide the long-term management of wetlands, forests, shorelines, and other natural features. The Town is also advancing watershed-based studies, such as the Four Mile Creek Subwatershed Study, to address flooding and erosion risks linked to climate change.

Residents are encouraged to follow the Town's Community Events Calendar for upcoming climate-related activities and opportunities. Interested in partnering on a climate event or project? DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

What is planning?

Land use planning plays an important role in shaping our community. The purpose of land use planning is to manage land and resources to create a safe, healthy and inviting place to live, work and play.

Who sets the rules?

In Ontario, the Province, Region, and the Town all work together to plan how communities grow. The Province makes the main rules through the *Planning Act* and the Provincial Planning Statement (PPS). These rules help protect the environment and make sure municipalities grow sustainably. In Niagara-on-the-Lake, our unique landscape is also protected by the Greenbelt Plan and the Niagara Escarpment Plan.

The Town must follow these provincial rules when creating and implementing its own plans, such as the Official Plan and Zoning By-law. These plans work together to guide development and support a healthy, thriving community. Decisions on local planning matters are made by Town Council or the Committee of Adjustment.

The Town celebrates and is defined by our extensive cultural heritage. The *Ontario Heritage Act* promotes the protection and conservation of cultural heritage assets. In Niagara-on-the-Lake, the Municipal Heritage Committee reviews Heritage Permit Applications and Heritage Designation By-laws, and gives advice to Council.

How can community members get involved?

Community input is an important part of the planning process. The Town encourages public engagement and feedback on planning matters. All comments received are considered in the review of planning applications. Community members can get involved in the planning process in a few ways: through attending and participating in Open Houses and Public Meetings and/or providing written comments. For nearly a century, Niagara District Airport has been a part of the Niagara-on-the-Lake community — serving as a flight training school during the Second World War and supporting aviation in Niagara ever since.

Today, the airport continues to serve local residents and businesses through executive and personal charter services, helicopter and fixed-wing sightseeing experiences, and ongoing flight training. It also supports search and rescue operations for the Canadian Armed Forces, Canadian Coast Guard, and Civil Air Rescue Emergency Service (CARES Niagara).

Niagara District Airport's 2025-2045 Master Plan presents a vision to grow the facility into a modern regional gateway. Introducing commercial service will provide local residents with a closer, more convenient option for travel across North America — including domestic, international, and popular sun destinations. While in the early stages, meaningful steps are underway to bring this vision to life.

The redevelopment project will bring new opportunities for Niagara — supporting long-term employment, strengthening the local economy, and helping grow our region's tourism sector. By building on its long-standing role in the community, Niagara District Airport can continue to contribute to steady, sustainable growth that benefits residents today and generations to come.

FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services Department is made up of seven administrative staff, 100 volunteer firefighters and 10 volunteer public educators who work together to create an efficient and high-quality emergency service. With a dedication to prevention, education, and emergency response, Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services' goal is to be high-performing, progressive, and visionary in the provision of emergency services within the community.



GREEN LIGHT AWARENESS

Keep an eye out for the green light when driving in Niagara-on-the-Lake. When volunteer firefighters respond to an emergency, they first drive their personal vehicles to their respective fire stations before they can respond to the emergency in the fire trucks that we're all familiar with. A green light may appear in any type of vehicle at any time of the day or night. When you see a green light, please yield to the right and let the vehicle pass. The faster firefighters get to their stations, the faster they can get the fire trucks responding to the emergency scene.

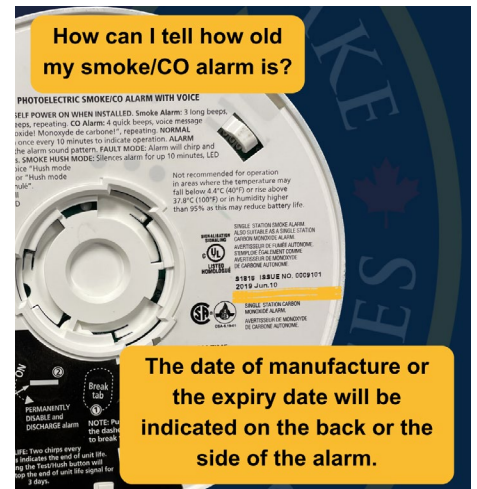
SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS EXPIRE

Many people don't realize that smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms expire. Most smoke and smoke/CO combination alarms last 10 years, while stand-alone CO alarms expire in five to seven years, depending on the brand. Check the manufacturer or expiration date on the back or side of your alarm. If you can't find it and the alarm seems old, replace it. An expired alarm may not work properly, putting you at risk. Check yours today; it could save your life!

SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM MAINTENANCE

In Ontario, working smoke alarms are required by law on every level of your home, outside sleeping areas. Carbon monoxide alarms are required on every level of your home that has a bedroom or where someone sleeps, outside of sleeping areas. Have a look at the tips below to make sure your home is protected.

- Confirm that your alarms have not expired by looking at the date on the back or side of the device. If an alarm is expired, replace it.
- Make sure your alarms function properly by pressing the "Test" button at least once a month.
- Familiarize yourself with the alarms' sounds and signals by referring to the manufacturer's instructions, checking the information on the back of the device, or listening to the different alarm sounds when you test the device.
- Change the batteries in every alarm at least twice a year.
- If your alarms are hardwired, replace the battery backups in every alarm at least twice a year to ensure operation during power outages.
- Keep your smoke alarms clean by gently vacuuming them to ensure they can accurately sense smoke.

FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

OPEN-AIR BURNING & BACKYARD CAMPFIRES

In Niagara-on-the-Lake, open-air burns are only permitted for farmers to burn off their agricultural waste in rural areas of town who have applied for permission annually on the Town's website and are following the provided guidelines. Open-air burning is not permitted in urban areas of town. Burning garbage or construction waste is not permitted at any time and is subject to cost recovery fees for the Fire Department's response. Residents with yard waste are encouraged to bundle their yard waste and place it at the road for disposal with their household waste and recycling free of charge. Niagara-on-the-Lake residents who wish to have a backyard fire are encouraged to purchase a listed, natural gas or propane fire pit or table as these devices do not give off the undesirable smoke and embers that a wood-burning fire pit produces.



LITHIUM-ION BATTERY SAFETY

Lithium-ion battery fires are on the rise worldwide due to the increased use of batteries in everyday devices like phones, tablets, laptops, headphones, toys, and power or lawn equipment. If damaged or improperly used, these batteries can overheat, catch fire, or even explode. Knowing which devices in your home contain lithium-ion batteries and ensuring they have proper safety certifications is essential, as some products sold in stores or online may not meet safety standards, increasing fire risk.

When charging a device, it is important to ensure:

- Always use the cables that came with the product to charge it and follow the instructions from the manufacturer.
- If you need a new charger, buy one from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved.
- Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't charge it under a pillow, on a bed, or on a couch, as this could cause a fire.
- Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.

Recycling Batteries

- Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could catch fire.
- Recycling your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location is the best way to dispose of them. Visit www.call2recycle.org to find a recycling spot near you.

Significant rainfall can lead to extensive flooding, impacting municipal infrastructure, private residences, and public properties. Niagara-on-the-Lake residents may experience unexpected surges in water levels during heavy rainfall due to several factors, including blocked waterways, dry ground, changes to the natural drainage pathways, overflowing storm drains, etc.



PRE-RAINFALL PREPARATIONS

TOWN STAFF'S ACTION

- 1 Clear catch basins, inlets, and culverts.
- 2 Inspect storm ponds.
- 3 Conduct ditching operations to ensure effective water flow.

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP

- 1 Regularly clear debris from catch basins, gutters, and downspouts.
- 2 Ensure that sump pumps are functioning correctly.
- 3 Have an emergency plan in place.



DURING EXTREME RAINFALL

TOWN STAFF'S ACTION

- 1 Check and clear problem areas.
- 2 Erect signage and close roads as necessary for public safety.
- 3 Monitor and assess areas while waiting for water levels to lower.

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP

- 1 Ensure water is flowing away from your property.
- 2 Drive safely and avoid flooded areas.
- 3 Keep an eye on weather updates and advisories.



POST-STORM ACTIONS

TOWN STAFF'S ACTION

- 1 Repair roads and eroded shoulders, remove debris from ditches, catch basins and culverts as needed.
- 2 Communicate with residents who have submitted Service Requests related to flooding.

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP

- 1 Clear debris to restore water flow.
- 2 Submit a Service Request to the Town to report issues or concerns regarding flooding and property drainage.

SUBMIT A SERVICE REQUEST

The Town encourages residents who experience flooding-related issues to submit an online Service Request. To submit a request, **scan the QR code** or visit www.notl.com/request-service-or-file-issue.



PUBLIC SERVICES

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

The Niagara Region manages residential curbside garbage collection, including large household items, organics (green bin), and leaf and yard waste. Circular Materials manages residential blue/grey box recycling.

Download the Niagara Region Waste App to:

- View your address specific calendar, including holiday changes to waste collection.
- Use the search tool to find out how to properly dispose of your recyclables, organics and garbage.
- Report illegal dumping.
- Schedule a large item collection.
- Sign up for collection reminders.

Where can I buy/replace my blue/grey bins?

Residents can contact Miller Waste Systems, Niagara-on-the-Lake's collection contractor, to order blue/grey bins. Miller Waste Systems will deliver them directly to your home.

- Residents can continue picking up green bins only at Town Hall (1593 Four Mile Creek Road, Virgil). Business owners who show a receipt of bins purchased from the Niagara Region can pick up blue/grey and green bins at Town Hall.

HERITAGE PLANNING

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake is proud to celebrate and preserve its rich cultural heritage, which plays a vital role in defining the community's identity. To conserve this heritage, the Town has a Heritage Permit system in place. This system ensures that any proposed alterations to designated heritage properties conserve and enhance the cultural heritage value of these significant sites.

The Town's municipal heritage register includes 426 properties, consisting of:

- Part IV designated properties (individually designated under the *Ontario Heritage Act*).
- Part V designated properties (located within the Heritage Conservation District).
- Listed properties that are recognized for their heritage value but not formally designated.

In 2023, the Town launched its Priority Heritage Designation Program with 200 listed properties.

The Town has identified priority properties for designation. These properties were selected because they represent significant pieces of Niagara-on-the-Lake's history or identity. The priority properties were identified as those which, if lost due to demolition, neglect, or inappropriate alteration, would result in the substantial loss of a piece of Niagara-on-the-Lake history or identity. Progress continues on evaluating and designating properties on the priority lists.

QUEEN-PICTON (OLD TOWN) HERITAGE CONSERVATION DISTRICT STUDY (HCD)

The Phase One of the Study was approved by Council in June 2025, and Council directed Staff to begin Phase 2 which involved further opportunities for public engagement. Additionally, Council had also adopted a Study Area By-law identifying an area of Old Town to be evaluated for expansion of the heritage conservation district currently bounded by Prideaux, Wellington, Johnson and Gate Streets surrounding the commercial core of Old Town. This By-law placed a temporary one-year restriction on alterations to properties within the Study Area, with exemptions for minor alterations while the Study is underway, the by-law expired in February 2026.

As part of Phase 2, a draft HCD Plan was prepared in accordance with the Ontario Heritage Act and included a Statement of Cultural Heritage Value, heritage attributes, district objectives, policies and guidelines for contributing and non-contributing properties, public realm guidance, and implementation measures. The draft plan identified 255 contributing properties out of 533 total properties within the proposed expanded district boundary (over 47% contributing), meeting provincial requirements under the Ontario Heritage Act and Ontario Regulation 9/06. The HCD Plan was approved by Council in February 2026 and pending any appeals, Council provided direction to begin Phase 3 which is the Implementation Phase of the expanded district.

LICENCES & PERMITS

BUILDING

The Town's Building Services Division helps keep the community safe by ensuring construction projects comply with the Ontario Building Code and applicable regulations. Inspectors work with homeowners, builders, and designers through plan reviews and key inspections to ensure buildings are safe, durable, and fit for their intended use across Niagara-on-the-Lake.

Why Building Inspections Matter

Building inspections help ensure homes and buildings are constructed and renovated safely, supporting long-lasting spaces for residents and visitors while helping protect the character of our town.

When a Building Permit is Required

A building permit is required for many types of construction and renovation projects, including but not limited to:

- Construction of buildings greater than 10 square metres
- Decks more than 600 millimetres above grade
- Sheds greater than 15 square metres
- Demolition of existing structures
- Additions to existing buildings
- Interior renovations involving structural changes and/or plumbing modifications
- Finished basements
- Basement damp-proofing
- Changes in the use of a building (including the creation of secondary dwelling units)
- Replacement of water, storm, or sanitary sewer lines

Obtaining a permit before starting work helps ensure your project meets safety standards and avoids potential delays or costly corrections.

DOGS

We love our furry friends in Niagara-on-the-Lake!

Niagara-on-the-Lake dog owners are required to register and vaccinate their dogs against rabies. Dog licenses are valid for a full 365 days after the date of purchase. Residents must obtain a current year's license within 14 days of acquiring or moving a dog into Niagara-on-the-Lake. Registration includes a unique license tag, which serves as an official license and offers the HomeSafe™ 24/7 lost pet service. Dog owners can purchase a license online at www.notl.docupet.com.

A Heritage Permit is required when the owner of a designated property wants to alter the exterior of a building designated under Part V or the designated portions of a building designated under Part IV of the *Ontario Heritage Act*. Building a fence, putting in a pool, planting a tree, or completing any other small digging project? Request a locate from Ontario One Call if you plan to dig in your yard. It is important to contact Ontario One Call so you can dig safely. Please visit www.ontarioonecall.ca or call 1-800-400-2255 before you dig.

SHORT TERM RENTAL

In the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake, a license is required to operate a Short Term Rental including a Bed & Breakfast, Cottage Rental, Country Inn, Villa or Vacation Apartment. A renewal application must be submitted every four years to maintain an active license, which includes a re-inspection of the Short Term Rental. This ensures that the Short Term Rental continues to meet the safety standards set forth by the Ontario Fire Code and the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake By-laws.

The Town's By-law Enforcement Officers work in partnership with the Short Term Rental compliance program, Granicus, to provide support to the community. Residents can use an online reporting system to submit concerns regarding Short Term Rentals. They can also contact Granicus and speak to a Host Compliance Operator, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, by calling 289-210-7226. TREES

Property owners are required to apply for a Tree Removal Permit before removing any tree with a trunk measuring 12.5 cm or larger in diameter. 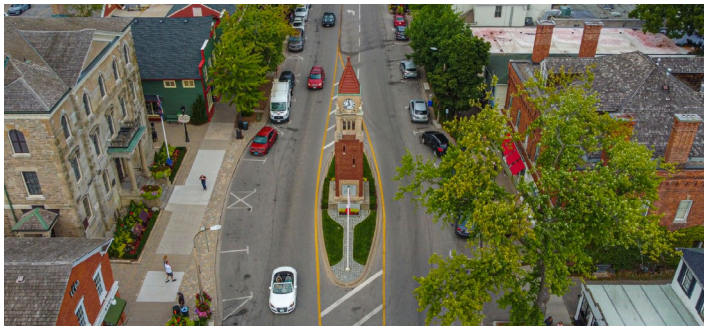

PARKING IN NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE

Planning a visit to the picturesque and historic Heritage District of Niagara-on-the-Lake? While parking is free at Town facilities and most areas outside the Heritage District, paid parking is in effect within the Heritage District. Be sure to check signage for locations, rates, and regulations to ensure a smooth visit. The Town offers convenient parking payment options. Payment can be made online through HONK Mobile or ParkedIn, or use one of the payment machines located in the Heritage District.



RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS

Resident Parking Permits are available exclusively to residents of Niagara-on-the-Lake. Permit holders can park in any metered parking space or lot in the Heritage District (Old Town) for up to three hours at one time. It's perfect for visiting Old Town to shop, dine, or catch a show! Permits cost \$40.00 and can be purchased online at www.notl.com/town-services/parking or by visiting the Town Hall at 1593 Four Mile Creek Road in Virgil. Valid identification is required as proof of address to obtain a permit. Permits are valid for the vehicle identified by license plate number, are nontransferable, and are valid from January 1 to December 31.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

Accessible parking spaces are located throughout Town on the street and in municipal parking lots. All vehicles parking in an accessible space must display a valid Accessible Parking Permit on their dashboard and are not required to pay for parking. The fine for parking in an accessible space without a valid permit displayed is \$400.00.

PARKING REMINDERS

- Please do not block driveways or sidewalks.
- Pay close attention to posted signs limiting or restricting parking.
- Parking your vehicle within 10 metres of an intersection or 3 meters of a fire hydrant is not allowed.
- You may not park in one spot for longer than 12 hours at one time.
- Always park your vehicle in the same direction as the flow of traffic.

Property taxes in Niagara-on-the-Lake fund essential services like road maintenance, parks, fire and emergency services, community programs, and more.

The Town issues tax bills twice a year: the Interim Tax Bill in February and the Final Tax Bill in July, each payable in two installments. Payment options include pre-authorized payments, online banking, credit card payments (via Paymentus, with fees), and in-person at Town Hall (1593 Four Mile Creek Road) or by mail. Residents can also sign up for e-billing (eSend) for digital statements.

WATER & WASTEWATER



The Town is proud to have a dedicated Water Division who is responsible for maintaining over 202 km of water mains, 1,383 valves, and 21 sampling stations across all five villages.

This year, Town Staff will once again be carrying out several preventative maintenance projects to ensure the continued safety and reliability of the Town's water and wastewater systems.

Planned work includes routine maintenance of all Town-owned fire hydrants, distribution water main valves, and inspections and maintenance of privately owned fire hydrants. Staff will also be installing automatic flushers in select areas of town where additional water turnover is required to maintain optimal chlorine residual levels.

In addition, the water distribution system will be flushed throughout town. These measures help provide fresh, high-quality drinking water to residents. The sanitary sewer system will also be flushed to remove buildup, reduce the risk of blockages, and help minimize odours.

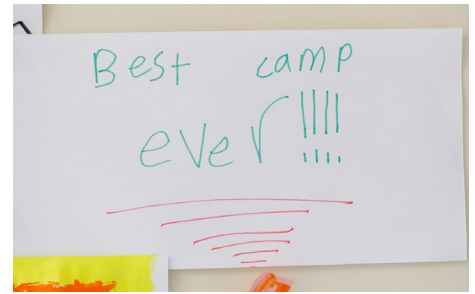
