BY-LAW

The Municipal Act allows municipalities to pass By-laws for the regulation of many areas affecting health, safety and the enjoyment of property. The following By-laws make up part of the Town's established list: Urban Tree Removal; Animal Care and Control; Clean Yards; Property Standards; Private Outdoor Swimming Pools and Hot Tub Enclosures; Noise and Parking; and others as listed on the Town's website www.notl.com.

CEMETERY SERVICES

Lakeshore Cemetery – 1483 Lakeshore Road, Niagara-on-the-Lake

All administrative functions of the cemetery are managed at the cemetery at 1483 Lakeshore Road. This includes transactions such as lot purchases, interments, cremation scatterings, and record and lot availability inquiries. Please make an appointment prior to your visit.

The Town has an online burial site and marker lookup tool, a mapping application designed to help users search for loved one's locations and burial plots within the Niagara Lakeshore Cemetery. DEVELOPMENT

The purpose of land use planning is to manage land and resources so that citizens have a safe and healthy environment to live in, access to housing, options to get where they need to go, and spaces to meet, gather, work, and play.

The responsibility for planning in Ontario is shared between the province and municipalities. The province sets the ground rules and directions for land use planning through the Planning Act and the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS). In Niagara-on-the-Lake, area-specific provincial plans, including the Greenbelt Plan, Niagara Escarpment Plan and Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe and the Niagara Official Plan, work together with the PPS to manage growth and protect agricultural land and the natural environment.

The Town is responsible for implementing the provincial and regional land use planning policy framework through the Town Official Plan and Zoning By-law. Through Council and/or the Committee of Adjustment, the Town is also responsible for making land use planning decisions to achieve the community's economic, social and environmental objectives. Municipal decisions on development applications must be consistent with the PPS and "conform to" provincial plans, which means that municipalities are given some flexibility in deciding how best to achieve provincial policy direction.

Citizen input on development applications is an important part of the planning process. As such, we encourage public comment on planning matters; all comments received are considered in the review of development applications. FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

NOTL FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services Department is a volunteer organization made up of 100 firefighters who all work together to create an efficient and high-quality emergency service. With a dedication to prevention, education, and emergency response, Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services' goal is to be high-performing, progressive, and visionary in the provision of emergency services within the community.



GREEN LIGHT AWARENESS

Life and death situations are often decided on how fast help arrives. Flashing green lights are used by volunteer firefighters who are responding to an emergency. We ask you to be courteous and yield the right of way when you see an approaching vehicle displaying a flashing green light.

FURNACE SAFETY

As fall approaches and the temperature drops, it's time to start our home furnaces for the fall/winter season. Natural gas furnaces are the most common type of home furnace, which can come with some safety risks if they are not properly maintained. Please keep these tips in mind when turning the heat on this season:

- Schedule an annual cleaning and service by a licensed technician before turning the furnace on for the first time this year. A faulty furnace can produce carbon monoxide if it is not maintained correctly.
- Change the air filter regularly as excessive dust can build up, creating a fire hazard.
- Don't store anything combustible near your furnace. Heating appliances need to have a clear space maintained around them at all times.
- Ensure you have a working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in your home if you have any fuel-burning appliances or an attached garage.

OPEN-AIR BURNING/BACKYARD CAMPFIRES

In Niagara-on-the-Lake, open-air burns are only permitted for farmers to burn off their agricultural waste in rural areas of town. Residents with yard waste are encouraged to bundle their yard waste and place it at the road for disposal with their household waste and recycling free of charge. Open-air burning is not permitted in urban areas of town. Burning garbage or construction waste is not permitted at any time and is subject to cost recovery fees for a Fire Department's response. Niagara-on-the-Lake residents who wish to have a backyard fire are encouraged to purchase a listed, natural gas or propane fire pit or table as these devices do not give off the undesirable smoke and embers that a wood-burning fire pit produces.

FIREPLACE & SPACE HEATER SAFETY

If you have a wood-burning fireplace in your home, be sure to have your chimney inspected annually and cleaned, if necessary, by a licensed technician. You should also have an easily accessible fire extinguisher stored nearby - a single spark can start a fire, so it's best to be prepared. If you have a natural gas fireplace in your home, be sure to have it inspected annually by a licensed technician. NEVER leave your wood-burning fireplace unattended, and turn off gas fireplaces when you leave the room. Space heaters need space! Never leave your space heater unattended while in use, and do not use it near or on anything combustible. Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for the safe use.

SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS EXPIRE

Many people may not realize that their smoke or carbon monoxide (CO) alarms could be expired. Smoke alarms typically have a lifespan of ten years after the manufacturing date, though this can vary by brand. Ensuring your alarms are working is crucial because they serve as your first line of defence, providing early warnings during fires or gas emergencies. Most alarms either have a clear expiration date indicated or display their date of manufacture.

Electronic devices, including smoke and CO alarms, don't last forever. Over time, they can become less reliable. These electronic devices operate around the clock, every day of the year, and eventually wear out. Don't wait; check yours today – it could save your life!

- Confirm that your alarm has not expired and is operational.
- Change your batteries at least once a year.
- For hard-wired alarms, ensure the battery backups are functional to ensure operation during power outages.
- Test your alarms monthly to make sure they are working correctly.
- Keep your smoke alarms clean – you can gently vacuum them to ensure they can accurately sense smoke.
- Familiarize yourself with the alarm's signals by referring to the manufacturer's instructions or checking the information on the back of the device.

Taking these precautions can make a significant difference in your safety and the safety of your loved ones.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

The Niagara Region is responsible for collecting waste and recycling materials in Niagara-on-the-Lake. Their website, www.niagararegion.ca, contains information regarding weekly garbage collection schedule, leaf and yard waste, branch collection, organic recycling, and household hazardous waste drop-off locations.

Broken recycling bins, organics bins and kitchen catchers can be replaced free of charge at the Niagara-on-the-Lake Administration Building at 1593 Four Mile Creek in Virgil. New homeowners and renters are entitled to obtain one free set of bins if they don't have them when they move in. To pick up free containers, please present a copy of your transfer deed as evidence of the possession date of your home, or present a rental or lease agreement as evidence of your occupancy date.

CUSTOMER CHOICE

Choose your Price Plan

Regulated Price Plan customers (*residential and small business*) can choose their preferred price plan and can change up to once per billing cycle.

TIME-OF-USE (DEFAULT)

Time-of-use (TOU) is the default price plan for residential and small commercial accounts. The majority of residential and small commercial accounts are on TOU (89% and 98% respectively as of July 2023).

ULTRA-LOW OVERNIGHT **!NEW!**

Ultra-Low Overnight (ULO) is a variation of the Time-of-Use plan but benefits those who use a lot of electricity overnight and little during the day.

TIERED

With Tiered prices, you can use a certain amount of electricity each month at a lower price. Once that limit (*called a threshold*) is exceeded, a higher price applies.

More information on rates and advice on how to choose your plan is available on our website. Rates are set by the Ontario Energy Board every November 1 and will be announced shortly. Visit www.NOTLhydro.com for up-to-date rates.

To change your rate, visit our website and fill out a short form on-line. Paper forms are also available.

LICENSES & PERMITS

BUILDING

A building permit is required for the following construction activities:

- Buildings greater than 108 square feet
- Inground and above-ground swimming pools
- Decks greater than 24" above grade
- Sheds greater than 15 metres squared
- Demolition of existing structures
- Additions to existing buildings
- Structural interior renovations
- Finished basements
- Damp proofing basements
- Converting the use of a building
- Replacing sewer or sanitary lines

Please contact Building Services at 905-468-3266 ext. 287 early in project planning to determine all applicable requirements. Online building permit application services are available via Cloudpermit at www.ca.cloudpermit.com/login. EVENTS

A Special Event is an event which may occupy all or part of Town owned property or may result in the disruption of the local flow of traffic. A special event may be defined as, but not limited to, a parade, festival, filming, race, procession, and/or any other activity that may include the following component(s):

- Street closure(s)
- Fireworks or pyrotechnics
- Live entertainment
- Temporary structures/tents

- Service of food or alcohol
- Large volumes of vehicular or pedestrian traffic

GAMING

The Alcohol Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) is responsible for regulating and overseeing licensed lottery events (such as bingo, raffles and the sale of break open tickets) conducted by eligible charitable and religious organizations to raise funds to support charitable purposes. As part of the AGCO's regulatory responsibilities in the charitable sector, the AGCO administers, in partnership with municipalities, the regulatory framework governing the issuance of charitable lottery licences. A Council-approved Heritage Permit is required for alterations or demolition for properties designated under Parts IV or V of the Ontario Heritage Act. Please note that a Renewal Application must be submitted every four years to maintain an active license. In the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake you must hold a valid Short Term Rental License to operate. HONK MOBILE & FAQ

How does parking enforcement know someone has paid for their parking online via the Honk Mobile App?

The online system provides Town parking enforcement officers with a real-time list of license plates belonging to people who have paid using the Honk Mobile App. Users do not require a ticket stub or receipt to place on the dashboard.

Are users notified if their session is about to expire?

The Honk Mobile App will send users a text message 15 minutes before their parking is about to expire. Users can easily extend a session directly from their phones.

Is the Honk Mobile App free?

A payment method is not required to download the app or to sign up for a Honk Mobile account. However, users will need a valid VISA, Mastercard, American Express, Visa Debit, Masterpass, or PayPal account to pay for parking. Please note that a convenience fee of \$0.25 is charged for each transaction.

RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS

Resident Parking Permits for Old Town are available exclusively for Niagara-on-the-Lake residents at the cost of \$22.00 (2023 rate). The permit will be increasing to \$30.00 in January of 2024. They can be purchased online or by visiting the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake Administration Building at 1593 Four Mile Creek Road in Virgil. These parking permits entitle the permit holder to three hours of free parking at any parking meter/pay & display machine in the Heritage District. A valid piece of identification must be shown as proof of address to obtain a permit. Permits are valid for the vehicle identified by license plate number and are non-transferable. They are valid from January 1 to December 31 and can be renewed beginning October 1 of each year.

Do I need to purchase a new permit if I change my license plate?

You will need to obtain a replacement permit for a fee of \$6.00 (2023 rate).

I own multiple vehicles, may I move the permit between vehicles?

Permits are issued to a vehicle and must be attached to a license plate number.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

Accessible parking spaces are located throughout the Town on the street and in municipal parking lots. All vehicles parking in an accessible zone must display a valid Accessible Parking Permit on their dashboard and are not required to pay for parking. The fine for parking in an accessible space without a permit is \$400.00.

PARKING INFRACTIONS

- Directly interfering with traffic movement or snow removal.
- Parking for more than 12 hours at any one time.
- Parking in violation of No Parking zones.
- Parking within 10 metres (33 feet) of an intersection.
- Parking within 3 metres (10 feet) of a fire hydrant.
- Parking in front of or within 1.5 metres (5 feet) of a driveway.
- Blocking or partially blocking a sidewalk.

OFFICE OF THE CAO

The Corporate Services Department is responsible for keeping the municipal records and for the preparation and distribution of information, correspondence, and Committee and Council Agendas for Council and for the public.

FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES & BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

The Niagara-on-the-Lake Fire & Emergency Services and the By-law Enforcement Department include a dedicated volunteer fire department committed to delivering prompt, professional, and compassionate service to residents and visitors. The By-law Division plays a crucial role in ensuring community compliance and safety, working to maintain the well-being of our Town.

OPERATIONS

The Operations Department manages and maintains various aspects of our Town's public works infrastructure. This includes the oversight of roads, street lighting, water and waste-water systems, and the operation and maintenance of all recreational facilities, parks, and municipal properties, ensuring they are safe, efficient, and well-maintained for the benefit of our community.

WATER & WASTEWATER

The Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake owns and operates two separate drinking water distribution systems which are the Niagara-on-the-Lake drinking water system (Niagara-on-the-Lake DWS) and the Bevan Heights drinking water system (Bevan Heights DWS). The Town maintains responsibility for water distribution only; the facilities for water treatment and storage are owned and managed by the Niagara Region. The two drinking water systems distribute treated drinking water within a service area of approximately 12,600 Ha. The service area is bounded by Lake Ontario, the Niagara River, the City of Niagara Falls and the City of St. Catharines.

SAMPLE STATIONS

Curious what those green objects are that stand alone and look like green parking meters? They are water sample stations. These stations give the Town the ability to test the quality of the water we drink. As they provide a direct line to the watermain. These stations allow the Town to better enhance the Town's ability to test a wider area of the Town's water supply. With the already 15 stations within the system, the Town has a better ability to make sure the water you are drinking meets and exceeds Ministry Legislation where possible. The water system that the Town has is one of the best in the country and with the wider array of testing, we can stay on top of any issues that may arise.
